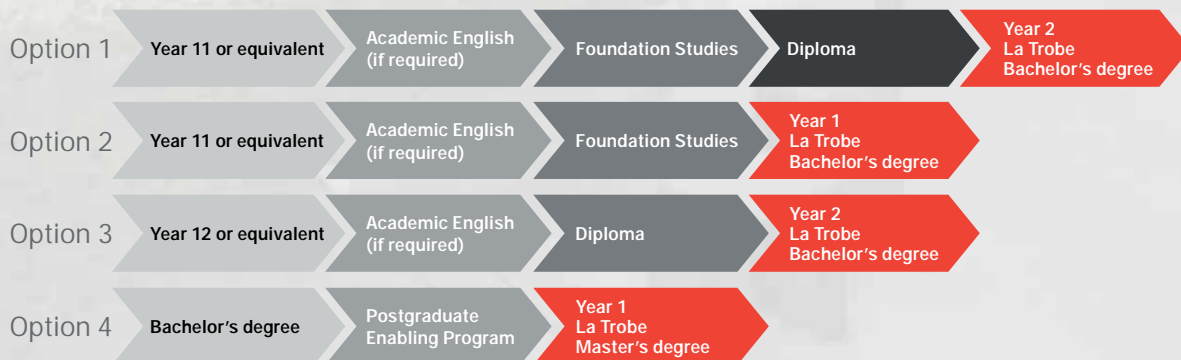

Using a multidisciplinary approach, the Diploma of Engineering is a practical course which will prepare you to design sustainable and creative solutions to complex and technical problems.

You'll get an introduction to civil, electrical and mechanical engineering, and begin to make ideas commercially viable as you bring them to life.

Depending on your chosen La Trobe degree you will develop skills in a number of core areas like biomedical engineering, communication engineering, electronic and electrical systems, sustainability in energy production, automotive engineering, the application of technology in modern medicine, project management of large-scale projects, sustainable infrastructure, water resources, civil construction, surveying and computer-aided design.

While studying the Diploma of Engineering, you'll also develop your mathematics and physical skills, while learning programming techniques commonly used by engineers and scientists.





Diploma of Psychology



If you are interested in psychology or aim to become a professional psychologist, the Diploma of Psychology offers a hands-on pathway into university studies.

You'll get an introduction to subjects relating to human behaviour, psychology, statistics and focus on clinical neuroscience. You will also learn about the psychology of culture and global citizenship, human relationships or even animal-human relationships.

After meeting minimum subject requirements, you'll be able to start in the second year of a Bachelor of Psychological Science at La Trobe University. Graduates of this degree often pursue careers as counsellors, public health workers, child protection officers, rehabilitation workers, youth workers or even human resources officers.

If you're planning to work as a registered psychologist you'll need to undertake further studies after your Bachelor's, including a fourth year of study and a postgraduate degree or a work placement.
